Brian R. Hollstein, *CPP*

Brian Hollstein serves Of Counsel to The Lukaszewski Group Inc. He is a former Director of Security for the Xerox Corporation, responsible for protection of the company's assets worldwide. Earlier in his tenure at Xerox, he was responsible for development of security programs for 26 Latin American affiliates. He also served as the government relations manager for the Corporation in Latin America. After retiring from Xerox, he joined Decision Strategies, a security consulting firm as a managing director working with major multinational companies to resolve problems in their overseas operations. Recently, he has been engaged in a private consulting practice focused on management of corporate security programs.

During 10 years of service as a special agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, he specialized in terrorism and organized crime on assignments in Florida, Puerto Rico, and New York. He also served as an officer in the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps in the Caribbean and on the General Staff at the Intelligence Center.

Mr. Hollstein received a B.A. from New York University. In addition, he attended Baruch College, CCNY, Johns Hopkins University, and was a candidate for a Masters Degree in Criminal Justice, C.W. Post University. Mr. Hollstein also attended executive training programs given by Harvard University and Georgetown University (Landegger Fellowship).

Mr. Hollstein was active on the International Disaster Assistance Council of the U.S. State Department during the Bush I administration and is currently an alumnus member of the Overseas Security Advisory Council, U.S. State Department. Mr. Hollstein is a past president and chairman of the board of directors of the American Society for Industrial Security (ASIS). He is a Certified Protection Professional. Mr. Hollstein served as secretary and vice chairman of the FBI Foundation and is a past director of the ASIS Foundation. He is currently serving as the volunteer manager of the FBI Oral History Heritage project, which is an initiative by the Society of Former Agents of the FBI to preserve the history of the FBI in recordings and make them available to researchers and scholars.

A frequently published author and lecturer on protecting proprietary information and using quality tools to manage the security function, he is currently at work on a book concerning implementation of quality programs.

Mr. Hollstein speaks Spanish and French and has traveled extensively in Latin America and Europe.
